Chairperson's Report	Student Trustee Update Trustee Kopellas commented the semester is going well. Students are getting involved and engaging.
President's Report	President Clark welcomed Trustee Taylor. His experiences will offer significant help to adult learners and BSUWorks which assists our students in employment upon graduation. He thanked the Board for its steady leadership, support and extensive involvement. He thanked faculty, librarians and staff for the tremendous hard work over the past few years and for showing compassion, dedication and selflessness. This semester has been a good and productive semester. They are mindful that all have come through trauma and are still experiencing it. Staff will continue to support our students and focus on mental health and how to engage them. 161 Summer Street (Martin Richard Institute) will soon be open. International partnerships continue and BSU continues to have an impact.
